# Please follow these Rules of Conduct for **Sound Transit passengers with bicycles**

To ensure you have a safe and pleasant experience, follow these Rules of Conduct on Sound Transit's vehicles and facilities.

#### At Sound Transit stations and facilities

- Obey all traffic rules and regulations.
- Walk your bicycle on Sound Transit vehicles or passenger platforms.
- Park bicycles at Sound Transit stations, transit centers and park-and-ride lots only in bicycle racks or lockers.
- Bicyclists are responsible for securing and carefully moving their bicycle on Sound Transit vehicles and at Sound Transit facilities to ensure their safety and the safety of other passengers.
- Bicyclists are responsible for any personal injuries or loss as a result of their negligence on Sound Transit vehicles or at Sound Transit facilities.
- In case of emergency, leave your bicycle secured on the vehicle or at the facility to avoid impeding others.





- Board train cars with your bicycle only at the doors marked with a bicycle symbol.
- Store bicycles on train cars only in the designated bike storage areas marked with a bicycle symbol.
- Try to spread bicycles out evenly among cars on Link and Sounder trains as storage areas become full.
- Do not occupy or store bicycles in areas designated for wheelchairs or senior priority seating areas.
- Avoid impeding free flow of passengers in aisles and exits.
- Protect other passengers from sharp edges on your bicycle.



### On buses

- Always load your bicycle from the curb side of the bus.
- Alert the driver by making voice and eye contact before loading your bicycle on the outside rack. When you are ready to leave and claim your bicycle, notify the driver and exit using the front door of the bus.

# To secure your bicycle

#### on a Sound Transit bus



Pull handle up, pull rack down



Lift bicycle into the rack space farthest from the bus



Place latch over tire and check that bike is secure

#### on Central Link light rail





Lift bicycle, and hang it on the hook.

#### on Tacoma Link light rail



On Tacoma Link, stand with your bicycle

#### on a Sounder train





Strap your front and rear wheels to the tie-downs located in cars with a bicycle symbol on the door. Sounder cars have space to tie down two bicycles.
